Does street photography have to be on an actual street or is it really about getting an image that captures the rhythm and complexity of everyday life? Our Wednesday evening club night zoom this week focussed on street photography and this question, starting with a brief history of the genre from its origins in the mid-19th century when it was just about recording what was in front of the camera to the modern vogue for intriguing storytelling images. We also took a look at seven rules for good street images: timing, composition, emotion and connection, storytelling, authenticity and candidness, light and environment, and individual style, along with some examples of classic street shots, before looking at a few of our own photographs with a view to helping each other get our images competition ready

This coming week is the last week of our regular season, there are though a couple of outings planned over the summer recess, details of the first of these are below. To mark the end of our season on Wednesday we will be going out for a photo-shoot along the Basingstoke Canal followed by a social in the Barley Mow at Winchfield. 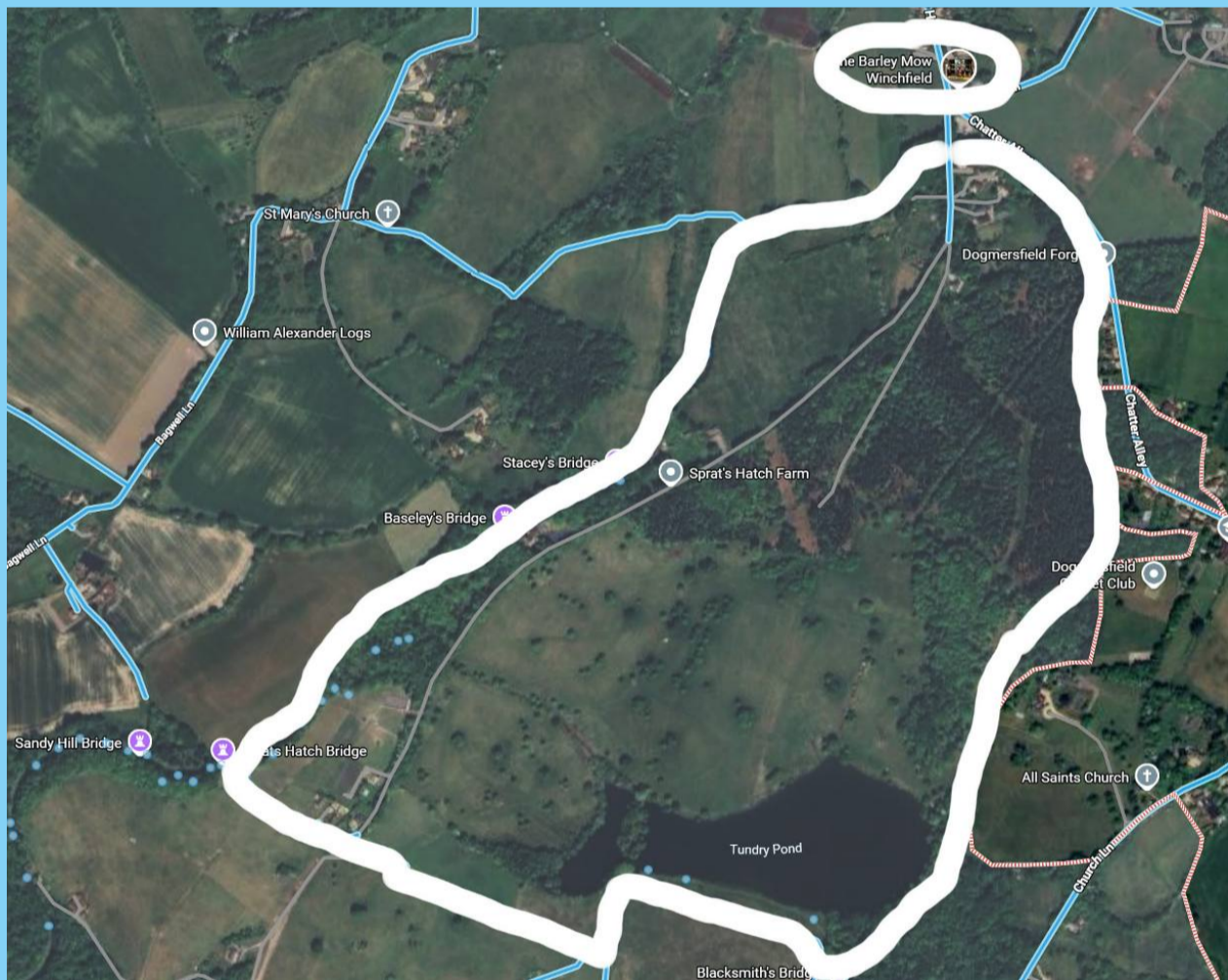

### **"Routes & Ringers"** **5-year Project with St. Andrew's Church Farnham**

I have been asked whether any of our members would be interested in volunteering in a photographic opportunity with a major Heritage Fund Project in Farnham.

St Andrew's church in Farnham has been successful in its application to the National Lottery Heritage Fund for the first (Development) phase of its "Routes & Ringers" project to address the church tower's structural issues that have silenced the church bells and caused much of the churchyard to be cordoned off.

Over the next two years work will be going on to develop an application which will result in major structural repairs and improvements to the church with a comprehensive programme of heritage engagement, including church bellringing, walking & pilgrimage, and arts and crafts. Scheduled to last 5 years there will be opportunities to capture everything involved in the project with the end product possibly being an exhibition(s), maybe a book, but certainly content for the project's website.

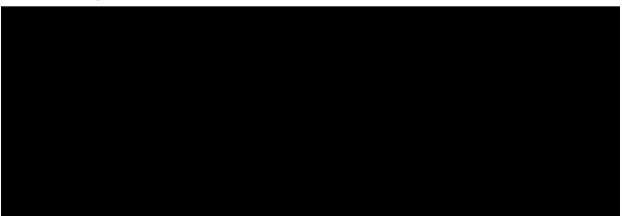
